## 1. Purpose

The purpose of the Graffiti Policy is to:

- Reduce the incidence of graffiti on council owned, public and private property by both removal and prevention
- Encourage, promote and provide a clean city (graffiti free) environment
- Display a welcoming and safe City to all who visit, reside, relax and conduct business within the City.

## 2. Scope

This policy applies to council owned, public and private property within the City of Charles Sturt.

### 3. Policy Statement

Graffiti is generally considered illegal (excluding legal/authorised work) and causes intentional damage to other people's property. Graffiti is often symptomatic of other social problems and can generally highlight and exacerbate a feeling of disunity and lack of harmony, reduced safety and pride in a local community, which in turn leads to further crime. In the event that graffiti vandals target property or specific areas, Council will support South Australian Police (SAPOL) with information and intelligence where necessary and may take appropriate action under statutory provisions.

The City of Charles Sturt will actively support and participate in the formulation of Statewide and Metropolitan wide initiatives aimed at the reduction of graffiti.

The City of Charles Sturt supports and encourages a clean (graffiti free) environment.

The Graffiti program objectives are:

- To reduce the incidence of graffiti vandalism by rapid removal of:
  - (a) Racist and obscene graffiti from council owned and public property within 2 working days;
  - (b) Racist and obscene graffiti from private property within 2 working days;
  - (c) Other graffiti within 5 working days (once permission is gained for private properties entry).
  - (d) graffiti removal from private property boundary within 5 working days.
- To improve community reporting by:
  - (a) Increasing awareness of reporting practices;
  - (b) Providing Graffiti Removal information on the Council web site;
  - (c) Advertising and promotion of the City's graffiti prevention program.
- To increase community participation and meaningful volunteering options in anti-graffiti programs.
- To encourage and support self-initiated removal practices.
- To work in partnership with commercial owners and contractors engaged by council to deliver the Graffiti removal service.
- To provide images to SAPOL for entry into the statewide database, as requested.
- To work collaboratively with South Australian Police and schools in early intervention programs.
